





Empowering Spanish-Speaking Families: The Community Impact of Leyendo Juntos

Through strong community partnerships, the Campaign for Grade-Level Reading's Leyendo Juntos initiative continues to connect with and support Spanish-speaking families. The Leyendo Juntos team is made up of representatives from Winchester Public Schools, United Way NSV, Handley Library, Building Bridges, Shenandoah University, the City of Winchester, John and Janice Wyatt Foundation and Opportunity Scholars. This collaboration enables a broader reach into our community and ability to focus on challenges specific to families whose first language is not English.

Leyendo Juntos, which means "Reading Together" in Spanish, is an effort to educate, empower and support local Hispanic families to better develop learning and literacy opportunities within the community. The project endeavors to find ways to create crosscultural understanding for Spanish-speaking families with school-aged children.

By partnering in programming with Handley Library, Building Bridges, Winchester Public Schools and Healthy Families NSV, the Campaign can offer parents support where they need it most. Leyendo Juntos programming is offered to children in conjunction with other family services, providing true wraparound support. For example, while parents are practicing their own language and literacy skills at Building Bridges, Leyendo Juntos staff and volunteers are engaging children with read aloud story times, written activities and crafts. Parents are also given the tools and resources to further engage with their children at home.


